PLAYER OF THE YEAR (POY) RESULTS

The board authorizes \$200.00 for the POY to encourage participation and rewards members for attaining a high level of excellence. At each event, points are awarded for field low net. Twenty-two places are awarded points beginning with 40, 30, 20, 19, 18, 17, etc. down to one point. For participation, the remaining players receive one point. For net ties, points are divided equally. For team events, two or four player teams, points will be divided equally. E.g., the first place team of two players will receive 35 points each. $(40 + 30)/2$. The second place team will receive 19.5 points each. $(20 + 19)/2$, etc. This will continue in 2018.

Going into our last event of the year at the South Course at Corica Park, it looks like Kenny Fong has a comfortable lead for the Player of the Year honors. But remember that first, second and third places for the TOC is worth 40, 30 and 20 points respectively. Doing the math, you can see who has a chance to be in the money. There are five payouts for the winners starting at \$50.00 in \$5.00 decrements to \$30.00. The winner also gets to keep the rotating trophy for the year. Last year's winners were:
