The 65th Club Championship was played over two days on August 19th and 20th at Poppy Ridge Golf Course - Livermore and Monarch Bay Golf Club - San Leandro, we hosted the 20th Daimo Cup this past weekend on September 10th at Boundary Oak Golf Course - Walnut Creek, iGolfClub's 2023 Intercity Tournament hosted by Vancouver Chinese Golf Club in Richmond, BC over the Labor Day weekend on September 2nd and 3rd, and our 2023 Match Play finalist competed in a tight match at the Stanford Golf Couse – Palo Alto on September 8th.

The 65th Club Championship


This year's Club Championship had 23 players competing for the title. At the end of day 1 of our two-day tournament format, our low gross leaders were William Tong 71, David Yip 74, Doug Deng 77, and George Kong 79. Witnessed by Jeanne Yip and Judy Huynh, William skillfully navigated the greens and scored 5 birdies and 4 pars in the front 9 with 5 under par to start the back 9. As if the birdie gods had endowed him on this day, he nabbed another birdie on the 18th hole ending the lowest gross round that William has ever played. Likewise, the low net leaderboard competition was equally fierce with Stephen Lee and William Tong tying net 66, Alam Lam net 69, Yao Liu net 70, and Bill Chen and Doug Deng net 71. It was anyone's game at this point.

Witnessed by Doug, our Tournament Chair, reported back the play-by-play events of the low gross competition between our leaders at Monarch Bay. With a ridiculous 1st round of 71, William headed into the 2nd round with a commanding 5 shots lead over his closest competitor. Against almost anyone else in our club, the lead would seem insurmountable but the closest competitor was none other than multiple Club Championship winner, David Yip. The round started off with William and David matching pars for the 1st 6 holes until David picked up a shot at the difficult par 3 7th hole with William making a bogey. The front 9 ended with David picking up another shot at the 9th hole. William and David shot amazing scores of +1 and -1, respectively, for the front 9 with David only three shots behind at the turn. David kept the pedal down at the back 9 picking up back-to-back shots at 11th and 12th hole to come within one shot of the lead. William battled back at the 14th hole to go up by two heading into the 15th hole where things took a dramatic turn that led to an unbelievable exciting finish.

15th hole: As anyone who have played Monarch Bay before knows the 15th hole is a challenging hole with water penalty area left and a bunker on the right side of the fairway. When the wind is up and blasting, which is most days, the hole can be downright brutal. William hit a good tee shot to the right rough with approximately 140 yards to a front pin hole location. He then elected to take two extra clubs because of the severe winds thinking if he goes long, he would end up in the middle or back of the green. He hit a gorgeous shot right at the pin into the afternoon sun so no one saw the ball land. When the group got on the green, they could not find William's ball for a couple of minutes and eventually found it over the back of the green passed the out of bounds stakes. William ended up making a triple bogey against David's par. Just like that, David took lead for the first time by one after the 15th hole and seemed to have all the momentum.

16th hole: With the momentum and the lead, David hit a good drive right down the middle while William pulled his tee shot to the left rough, then his second shot found the left fairway bunker, and his third shot made it to greenside right rough. On the other hand, David being David, made it on to the green in regulation with approximately 15 feet for birdie hoping to extend the lead. William was first to play his 4th shot off the green and amazingly chipped in for a birdie while David finished his putts for a par.

17th hole: A 200-yard par 3 into the wind, the 17th was a beast of a hole that day. Fresh off the chipped in birdie,

William had the honor to lead off and hit a nice shot safely to the front of the green with a middle pin location. That put the pressure on David to respond but his tee shot sailed right and landed in the greenside bunker. David was unable to get up-and-down and William took a one shot lead, with a 2-putt par, going into hole 18.

18th hole: A 270-yard par 4 which long hitters can attempt to drive the green. William still had the honor and hit an incredible tee shot that made it onto the front of the green. With William leading by one and a chance for an eagle putt, David had to eagle to have a realistic chance for the field low gross title. His tee shot leaked right to the rough with approximately 30 yards for his second shot. The pressure was on for David to hole his 2nd shot but ultimately his pitch shot landed short of the green and William putted out for a birdie, it was over. Congratulations to our...


